Public Works has been noticing improper dumping at various sites throughout town as well as in the back alleys for garbage, recycling, trees and compost. *Please note that continued infractions may result in a suspension of pickup until the issue(s) are remedied.*

## Garbage

- Do not leave water in the bottom of the bins
- Do not put unbagged dog droppings/cat litter in the bins
- All garbage MUST BE BAGGED. Loose garbage in or around bins will not be picked up.
- Garbage must be in proper pickup area.
- Do not leave broken bottles in the bottom of the bins.
- Garbage bags should not be over 25lbs max.
- Make sure there are no safety hazards near or inside your bin, such as insect nests.
- Ensure your bins are in good condition. Broken lids, sides, etc., should be repaired.
- Do not let your bin become tree covered and difficult to access.

## Tree Pile

- Branches must be neatly stacked and easy to pick up. They should be in the back alley in a location that doesn't block the alley;
- The tree pile at the lagoon is for trees only. Do not place pallets or lumber in the pile.

## Compost

- Do not put garbage, diapers, dog droppings, plastic containers, plastic bags, or any other items in that are not compostable.
- Compost dumped in alleys will not be picked up. Please bag it.
- There will now be a bin for compost out at the lagoon. Please dump your bags into the bin and the bin only. Please do not put plastic bags and containers into the compost bin. **COMPOSTABLE ITEMS ONLY.** If we continue to notice improper disposal, we will discontinue the service.




## SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING

Single-stream recycling is a system in which all recycle materials - fiber, plastics, glass, tin and aluminum - are placed, unsorted, in the BLUE Recycle Cart or Container.



**Cardboard, Boxboard, Office Paper, Newsprint, Junk Mail, Magazines and Catalogues**



**Plastic Containers, Milk Cartons & Plastic Milk Jugs, Shrink Wrap & Plastic Bags** - Plastics numbered 1 through 7 

No oil containers or chemical jugs



**Glass** (Food and beverage containers – must be rinsed)



**Tin and Aluminum Cans**

(cans must be clean, with or without labels – no steel or auto parts)

# North Valley Waste Management

The Household Hazardous Waste Depot is up and running. Accepted items are:

*Must be in original container with original label (s)*

## • PESTISIDES

- Poison symbol
- "Domestic" not agricultural nor industrial
- PCP (poison control product) #
- Max container size 10 L
- Max aerosol can 680g / 24 oz

## • TOXICS

- Poison & Danger Symbols
- Max container size 10 L
- Max aerosol can 680g / 24 oz
- Example:
  - Automotive additive
  - Furniture stripper
  - Tar and bug remover
  - Weed/Pest killer (Killlex, Round-up)

## • CORROSIVES

- Corrosive symbol
- Max container size 10 L
- Max aerosol can 680g / 24 oz
- Example:
  - Grout/Masonry/Concrete cleaner
  - Muriatic/Battery Acid
  - Bleach/Products with bleach
  - Hydrogen Peroxide
  - Hypochlorite-containing products
  - Pool and hot tub cleaners (algae remover, chlorine & bromine pucks)
  - Calcium/Lim/Rust remover

## • FLAMMABLE LIQUIDS

- Flammable symbol
- Max container size 10 L (25L for gas can/jerry can)
- Max aerosol can 680g / 24 oz
- Example:
  - Gasoline (must be in ULC-approved gas can/jerry can)
  - Acetone
  - BBQ lighter fluid
  - Camp stove fuel
  - Fondue fuel
  - Flammable degreasers
  - Flammable fuel treatment and additives
  - Flammable lubricants
  - Kerosene
  - Methanol
  - Methyl hydrate
  - Mineral Spirits
  - Paint stripper / thinner
  - Paint and varnish remover
  - Turpentine
  - Varsol
  - Other flammable solvents

## • PHYSICALLY HAZARDOUS PRODUCTS

- Flammable symbol & Explosives symbol
- Max container size 5 kg
  - Example:
    - Non-refillable fuel cylinders
      - Butane cylinders
      - Camping cylinders
      - Propane cylinders

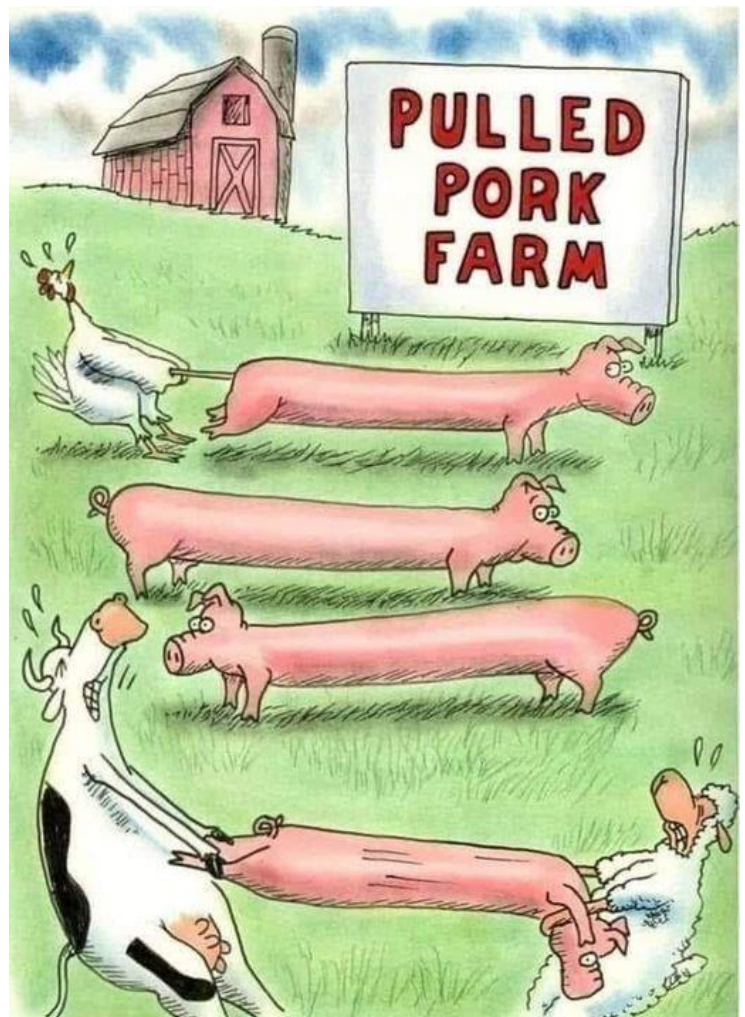

### ACCEPTABLE OILS:

Petroleum-based or synthetic oil typically used in:

- Engines
- Manual or automatic transmissions
- Differentials, transfer cases, gear boxes
- Power-steering
- Hydraulics
- Compressors

### ACCEPTABLE ANTIFREEZE:

Ethylene glycol used in engine or cooling/antifreeze applications.

\*\*\* Propylene glycol (i.e. plumbing/RV antifreeze) is not accepted \*\*\*

### ACCEPTABLE OIL FILTERS:

Spin-on, sump, element-style or cartridge-style used on engines, transmissions, hydraulic applications

- Coolant filter
- Diesel fuel filters
- Fuel filters used on diesel fuel storage tanks or pump islands
- Fuel filters used on home furnace fuel tank
- Plastic/paper element-style oil or fuel filters

### ACCEPTABLE CONTAINERS:

- Original plastic oil containers:
  - 250 mL - 50 L that hold the acceptable types of oil
- 2-cycle oil containers
  - ex: from snowmobile / outboard motor oil
- chain or saw guide oil containers
  - ex: from oil used to oil chain-saw chains, machinery chains, or saw-guide bearings
- metal-working or drill-bit oil containers
  - ex: from oil used to cool drill bits
- antifreeze containers
- diesel exhaust fluid containers

### UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS

*These may be accepted within other recycling programs at the landfill*

- Cooking oil or animal fats
- Diesel fuel
- Gasoline, kerosene
- General household plastics
- Grease and cartridges
- Paint, stain, or paint thinner
- Pesticides and containers
- Rust treatments and containers
- Solvents and degreasers
- Spray cans/aerosols
- Turpentine
- Under-coatings or tar
- Varnish or urethane coating
- Water if over 5% by volume in the oil
- Wax
- Windshield washer containers
  - These should be recycled with general household plastic when possible
- Engine air filters
- Furnace air filters

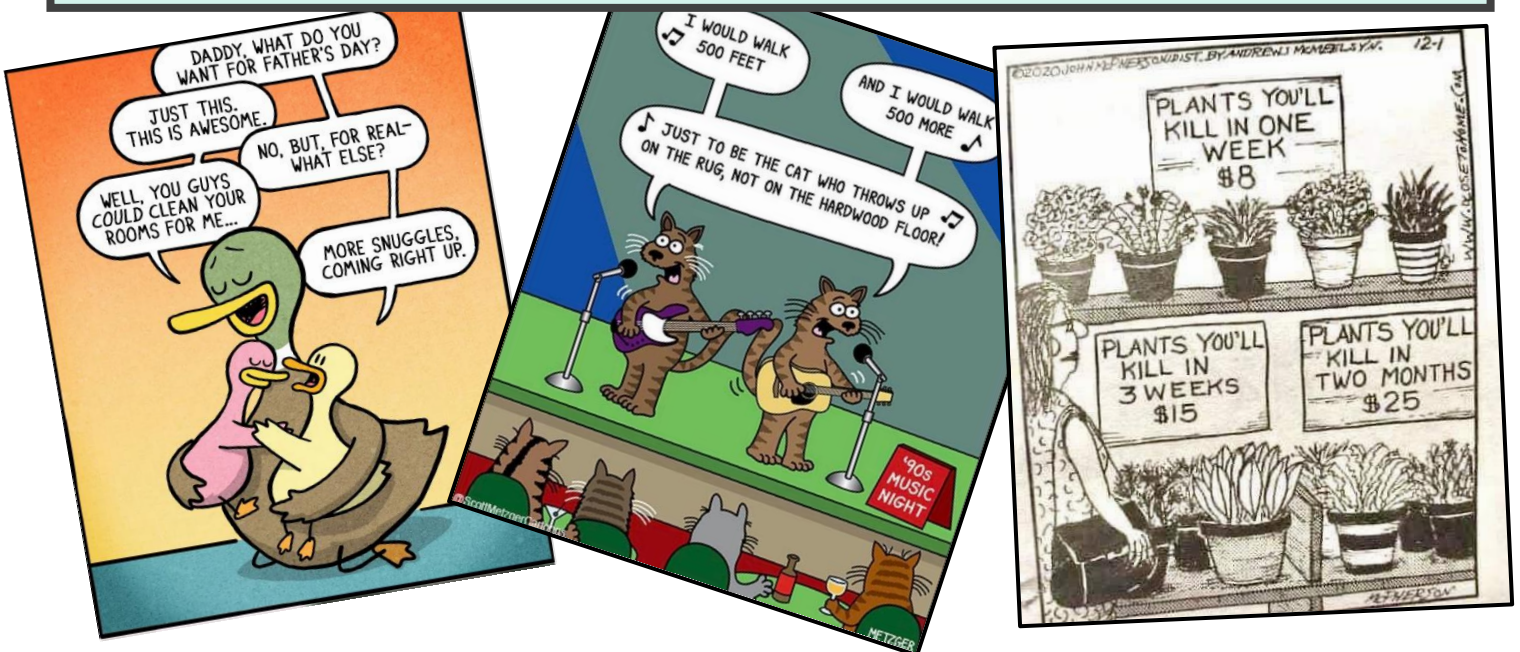
## WHEN IS A BUILDING PERMIT REQUIRED?

- New building construction garages, carports and boat houses
- Pole buildings (post-frame) or log buildings (must be designed under NBC Part 4)
- Decks or raised platforms with any walking surface over 600 mm (24”) above grade
- RTM, modular or manufactured/mobile homes (mobile homes are now called modular homes)
- Renovations or alterations affecting structural members or life safety (egress windows for bedrooms)
- Addition to an existing building
- Basement development in a dwelling
- Secondary suites (cannot exceed 80 m<sup>2</sup>) (860 ft<sup>2</sup>)
- Accessory buildings, greenhouses, or gazebos greater than 10 m<sup>2</sup> (107 ft<sup>2</sup>)
- Sunrooms (wood-framed and manufactured enclosures)
- Fireplaces and wood stoves
- Retaining walls (if their collapse could affect a structure or are built near a property line)
- Foundation repair or replacement
- Roof repair or replacement
- Solar panels (roof mount) and ground mount panels if built near a property line
- Change of building use or occupancy type
- Tenant/leasehold improvements in commercial buildings
- Temporary buildings or structures (fabric buildings/construction trailers/bleachers etc.)
- Relocation of an existing building
- Work to remedy an unsafe condition or fire official’s order
- Demolition of an existing building



## BUILDING PERMITS ARE NOT USUALLY REQUIRED FOR:

- Fences
- Driveways, sidewalks and parking lots
- Cosmetic upgrades or replacement not affecting structural or life safety
- Accessory buildings, greenhouses, or gazebos not greater than 10 m<sup>2</sup> (107 ft<sup>2</sup>) in area
- Some farm buildings (varies by rural municipality - check local municipal bylaws)
