Each fall, residents across Saskatchewan are encouraged to install working smoke alarms and carbon monoxide (CO) alarms during Fire Prevention Week (Oct. 10-14, 2022) and during Carbon Monoxide Awareness Week (the first week in November).

Under Saskatchewan's *Building Code Regulations*, it is mandatory that buildings with sleeping rooms must have both smoke and CO alarms installed. You can choose from many different types of alarms to suit your circumstances and building's layout: hard-wired alarms, 10-year battery-operated alarms, and in the case of CO alarms, ones that can be plugged into your electrical socket.

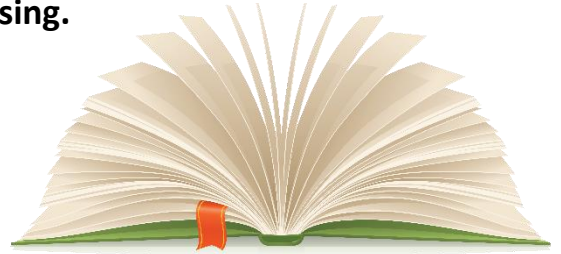
What's Up at the Library

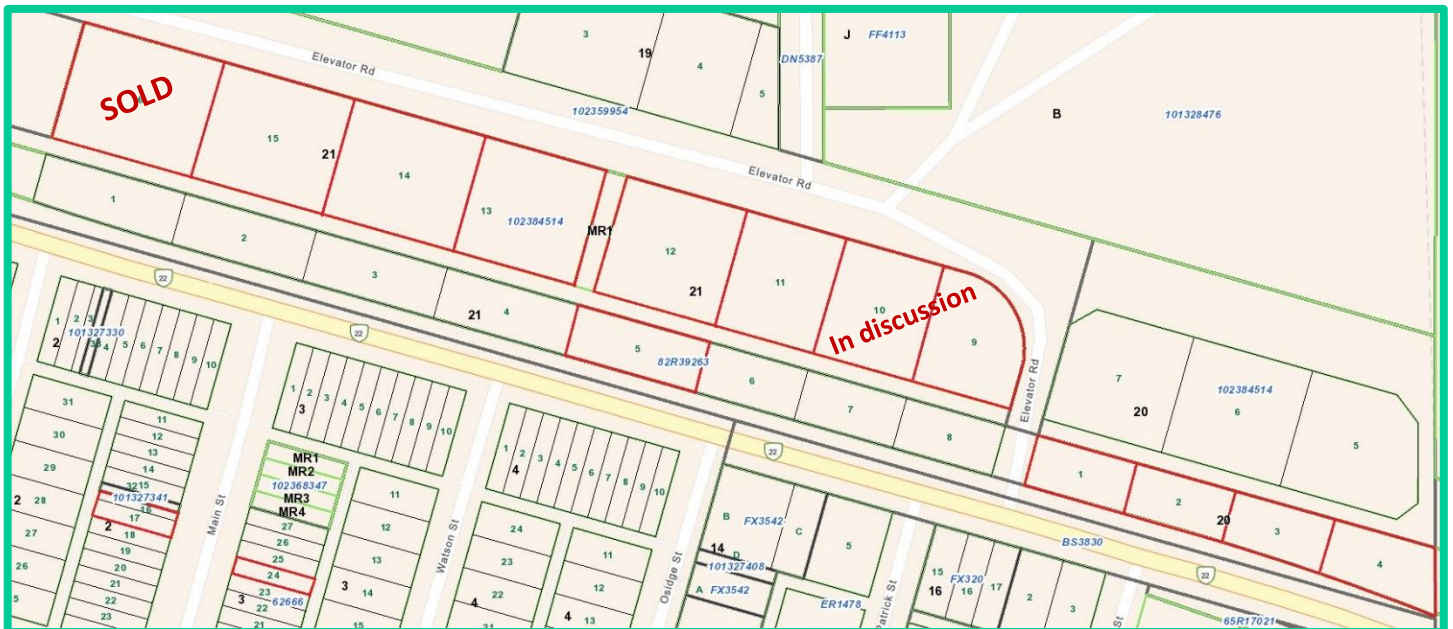
