LIPTON FIRE DEPARTMENT

WINTER FIRE SAFETY TIPS

SPACE HEATERS

- place a minimum of 3 ft away from anything flammable
- Turn off when you leave the room or go to sleep
- Never cover the cord or put anything on top of the heater

FIREPLACES AND WOOD STOVES

- Keep flammable materials at least 3 feet away
- Have your chimney inspected annually to prevent creosote buildup.
- burn only dry, seasoned wood, never painted or treated lumber.

FURNACES

- Keep your furnace vents clear!
- Look for snow or ice blocking the opening.
- Check again after a heavy snowfall or windstorm.
- Clear with a broom or brush

A blocked fresh air intake reduces energy, but a blocked exhaust can lead to carbon monoxide poisoning.



Snow Removal

As winter progresses, please make sure the snow you remove is not placed on the street after the grader has been by. Public works will not come back to clear it.

Please also do your best to have vehicles removed from streets. This prevents ridges from building up around vehicles, and makes snow removal much easier.

Public works piles the snow into the middle of each street, then hauls it away. Please be patient, we will get to your location.




