Water Rate Increase

The Village of Lipton and the Saskatchewan Municipal Board have approved a water rate increase of \$1.00 for both 2024 and 2025. This means that starting January 1, 2024 the amount you are charged for water will increase by \$1.00. Below is a portion of Schedule A from Bylaw 07-2023 Sewer and Water Bylaw.

1. Monthly Water Rates for users within the Village of Lipton limits:

All categories

3,000 gallons or less

Minimum \$49.00 for 2024

Minimum \$50.00 for 2025

and \$12.00 for each additional 1,000 gallons thereafter.

2. Monthly Water Rates for users outside the Village of Lipton limits:

3,000 gallons or less

Minimum \$71.35 for 2024

Minimum \$72.35 for 2025

and \$12.00 for each additional 1,000 gallons thereafter.

3. Monthly Infrastructure Fee (Water and Sewer upgrades)
