


### **Key FOBS for Truck Fill**

### Construction Code Act Changes

There is a new *Construction Code Act* that provincial building inspectors (PBI) will be following. A copy of it is available online. An updated section of *The Construction Code Act* requires all residential dwellings (new or existing) to have smoke and carbon monoxide alarms installed by July 1, 2022. For further reading visit www.saskatchewan.ca/btstandards. Specific to smoke alarms:

- They are required: on each story, in each sleeping room, and in hallway within 5m of bedroom doors
- Buildings constructed prior to June 6, 1988 can have battery operated smoke alarms, must be 10 year sealed battery units
- Buildings constructed after June 6, 1988 must have smoke alarms hard wired and interconnected so that all alarms will sound

#### Specific to carbon monoxide alarms:

- They are required if the dwelling contains a fuelburning appliance or a garage
- They are required: in each bedroom or within 5 m of each bedroom door
- Buildings constructed prior to October 1, 2009 can have battery operated carbon monoxide alarms, must be 10 year sealed battery units
- Buildings constructed after October 1, 2009 must have carbon monoxide alarms hard wired and interconnected so that all alarms will sound.

#### **Old Permits**

PBI has been working hard to clean up old and expired permits. In order to get them handled quickly they are charging extra fees for each additional inspection and report that must be preformed on a project. Please try to get your permits finished and closed to avoid incurring added costs.




