The annual Dutch Elm pruning ban is over as of September 1<sup>st</sup> until April 1<sup>st</sup>. Pruning outside the ban keeps trees healthy. If you hire someone to prune, check their qualifications. All commercial pruners of elm trees must complete a recognized training program or be supervised by someone who has. Improper pruning can spread diseases or damage your trees.

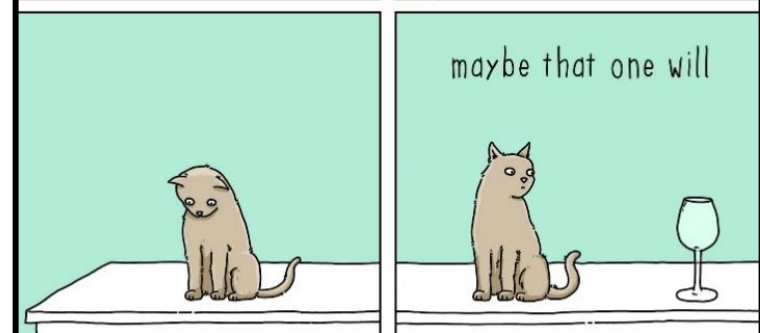
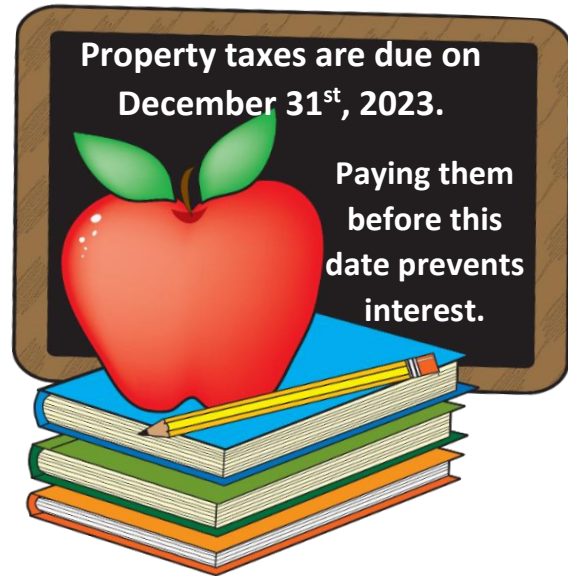

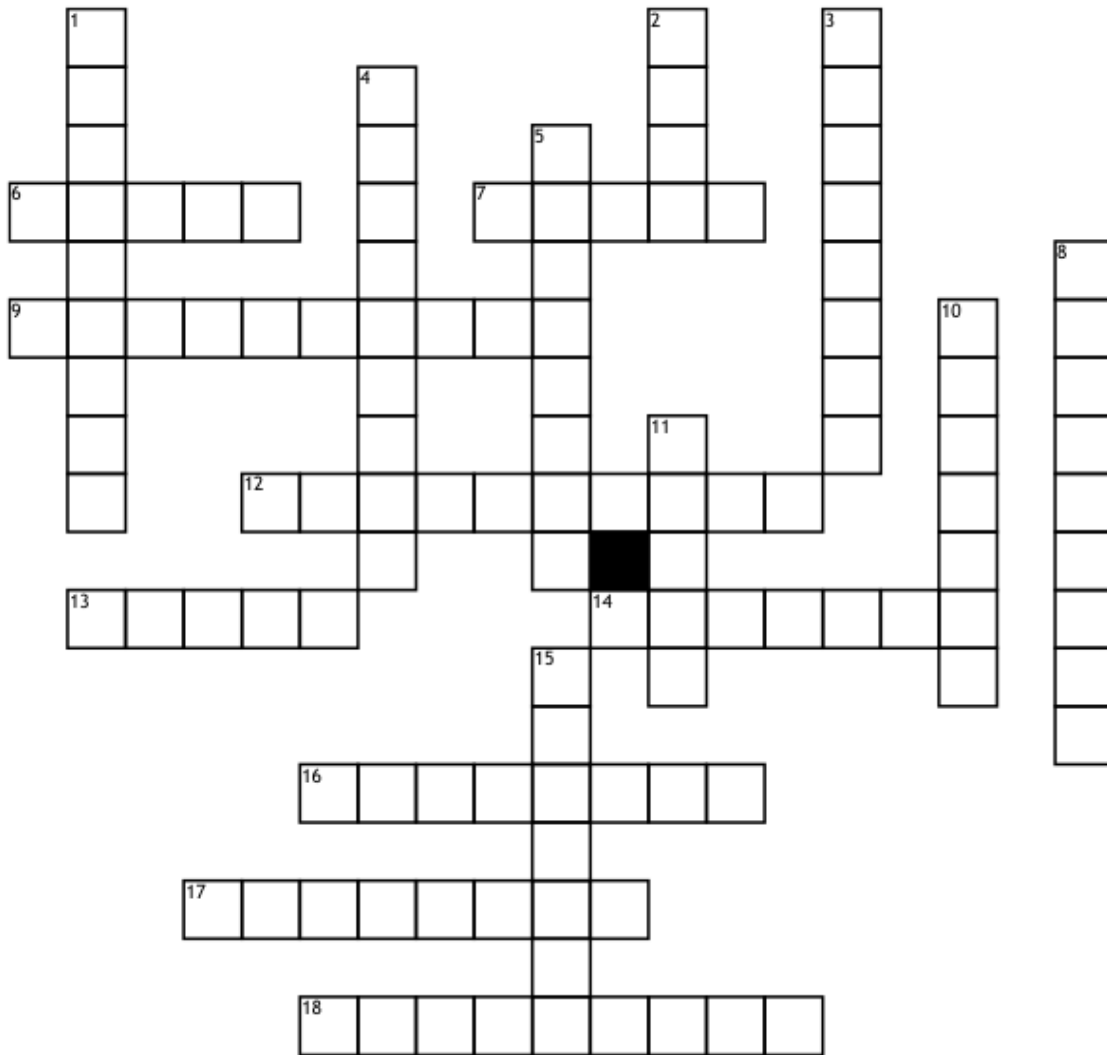
