LIPTON FIRE DEPARTMENT

2025 YEAR
IN REVIEW

CALLS

In total, LVFD responded to 17 calls in 2025. Service was provided by Lipton Volunteer Fire Department to residents in the Village of Lipton, R.M. of Lipton, and the R.M. of Tullymet. The department worked with organizations such as SGI/Ministry of Highways, STARS, and various Mutual aid partners including Cupar, Piapot First Nation, and Dysart Volunteer Fire Departments. The calls were for Structure, vegetation and implement fires, hazardous material accidents, and carbon monoxide alarms.

The diversity of the type of emergencies is challenging, and our volunteer firefighters have performed successfully during these calls, and I would like to thank them for their diligent service and attendance at the bi-monthly meetings and training sessions.

BUNKER SUITS

In 2025 our fire department acquired 6 new bunker suits. Three of the suits were donated by My Mutual insurance. LVFD matched the donation and purchased three more much needed suits.

EXTRACTOR

Cleaning of Personal Protection Equipment (PPE) is of great importance due to the health risks posed by contact with byproducts of burnt chemicals, furniture glues, automotive components, insulation, house coverings and all substances that create smoke and debris that we use daily. After a fire, carcinogens and residues remain on our gear and must be washed away with specific detergent at a certain temperature.

Using funds raised from banquets, fishing tournaments, and donations (for which we are deeply grateful), LVFD has purchased an industrial washing machine. This machine will extend the life of fire fighting garments, and greater protect the fire fighter from life threatening disease.

These are some of the highlights of a few of the projects and results of the hard work by our volunteers and the assistance of our benefactors, a few improvements every year, and teamwork by the community will make all the difference.



The Village of Lipton is now offering a \$500 scholarship to a qualifying student attending Lipton School!


The recipient of the scholarship must be a grade 12 student enrolled at Lipton School that will be attending post-secondary education.


