Fun Facts

- The tradition of decorating Christmas trees began in Germany in the 1500s. The first printed reference to a Christmas tree was in 1531.
- The tallest natural Christmas tree ever displayed was a 221-foot Douglas fir put up in Seattle in 1950.
- Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer was created in 1939 by a department store (Montgomery Ward) as a promotional booklet for children.
- Jingle Bells was originally written as a Thanksgiving song and was the first song broadcast from space in 1965.
- The image of Santa Claus, with his red suit and white beard, was popularized by Coca-Cola advertisements in the 1930s. Santa is based on Saint Nicholas, a 4th-century bishop known for his generosity.

Water Rate Increase

The Village of Lipton and the Saskatchewan Municipal Board have approved a rate increase of \$1.00 for water and \$1.00 for sewer for 2026. An increase of \$1.00 for WATER ONLY for 2027 has been approved. Below is a portion of Schedule A from Bylaw 07-2025 Sewer and Water Bylaw.

Bulk water rates are increasing by \$1.00 in 2026 and 2027.

1. Monthly Water Rates for users within the Village of Lipton limits:

All categories

3,000 gallons or less

Minimum \$51.00 for 2026

Minimum \$52.00 for 2027

and \$12.00 for each additional 1,000 gallons thereafter.

1. Monthly Water Rates for users outside the Village of Lipton limits:

3,000 gallons or less

Minimum \$72.35 for 2026

Minimum \$73.35 for 2027

and \$13.00 for each additional 1,000 gallons thereafter.

2. Monthly Infrastructure Fee (Water and Sewer upgrades)

Monthly fee:

Minimum \$25.00

3. Coin operated and Key FOB metered tank fill rate:

\$31.00 for 1,000 gallons for 2026
